

TRANSFORMING NURSING, COMMITTED TO CARING

Florida Atlantic University's Christine E. Lynn College of Nursing is internationally recognized for advancing the art and science of Caring. The College's pioneering research in the areas of healthy aging, holistic health, transforming practice environments and health equity is renowned and continually expanding. Its two nurse-managed interprofessional health centers, the Louis and Anne Green Memory and Wellness Center and the FAU Community Health Center are examples of transforming healthcare through a commitment to Caring.

The College of Nursing offers four degree programs –

- **The Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN)** prepares graduates as providers, designers, managers and coordinators of care in a variety of settings. The four tracks of nursing study at the baccalaureate level include freshman direct admission, traditional upper division, second-degree accelerated and RN to BSN.
- **The Master of Science in Nursing (MSN)** program prepares graduates for a variety of advanced nursing practice roles, including family or adult/gerontological nurse practitioner, holistic nurse, clinical nurse leader, nurse administrator or nurse educator. The program offers flexibility for full or part-time study.
- **The Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP)** prepares graduates for practice leadership that transforms healthcare delivery through shaping and evaluating practice models and influencing policy. The part-time post-MSN track is designed for advanced practice nurses and nurse administrators while the BSN to DNP program offers entry into the nurse practitioner concentrations. Classes are offered on weekends and online.
- **The Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.)** degree program prepares graduates to advance caring science through research and scholarship in areas of healthy aging, health equity, holistic health, and transforming practice environments. Classes are offered in a hybrid format on weekends and online. Both the post-MSN and BSN to Ph.D. tracks are available.
